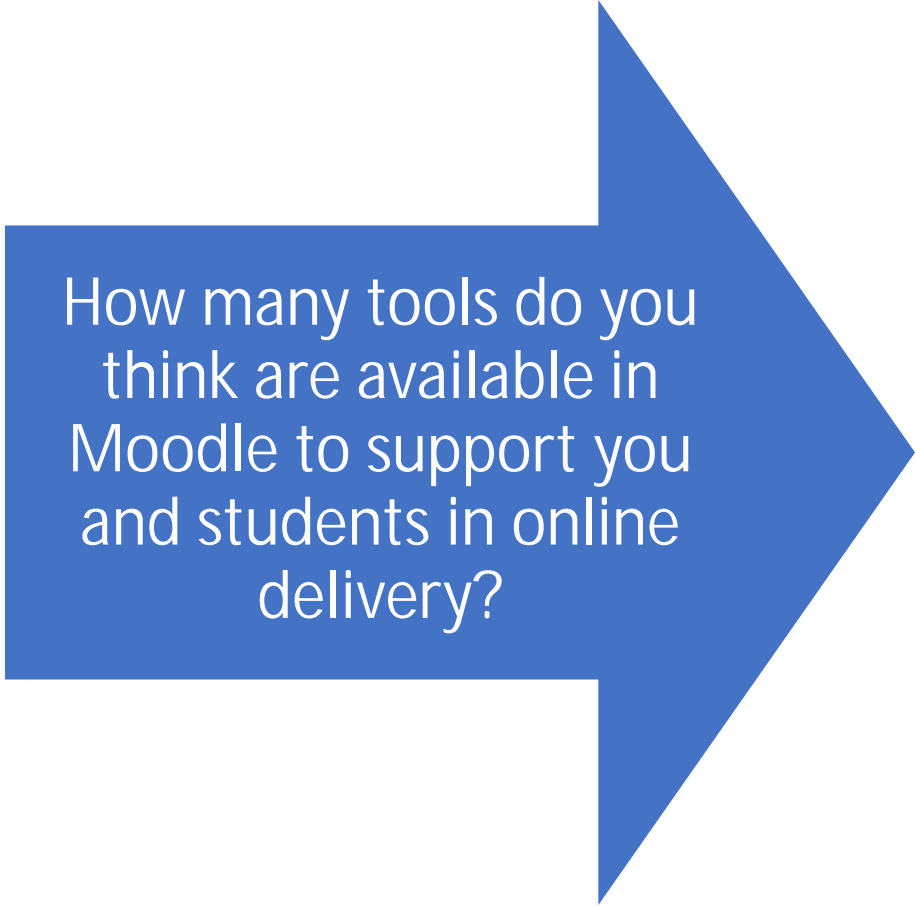

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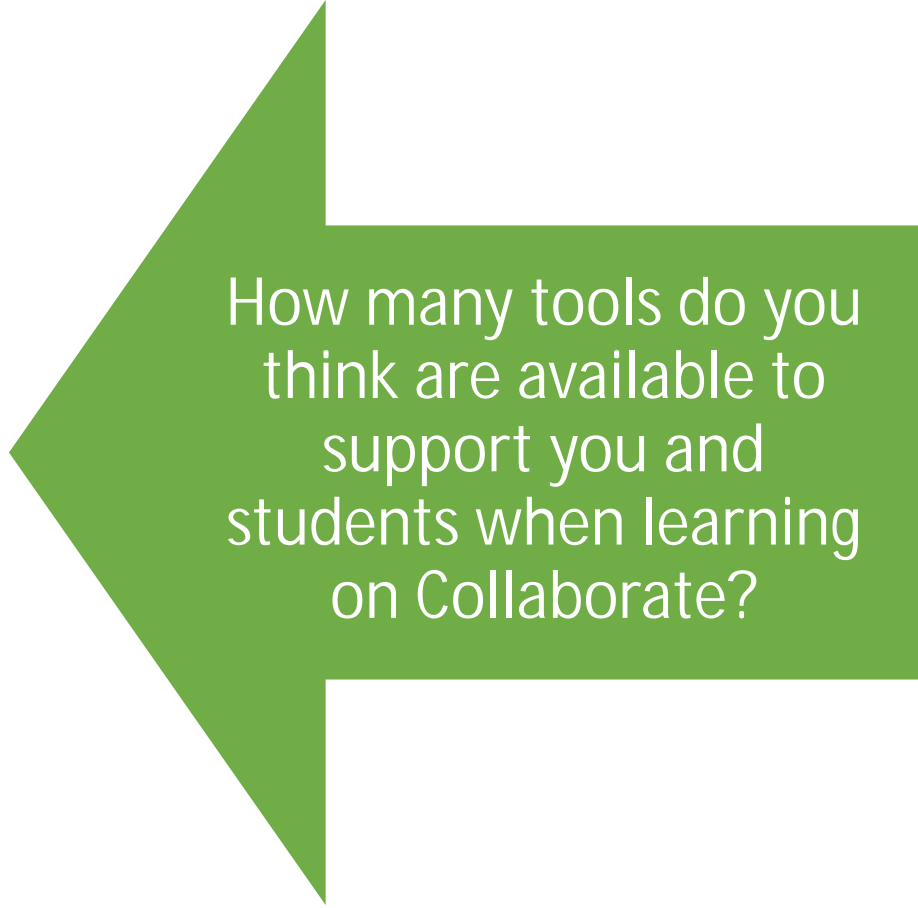

# Tools in Moodle and Collaborate



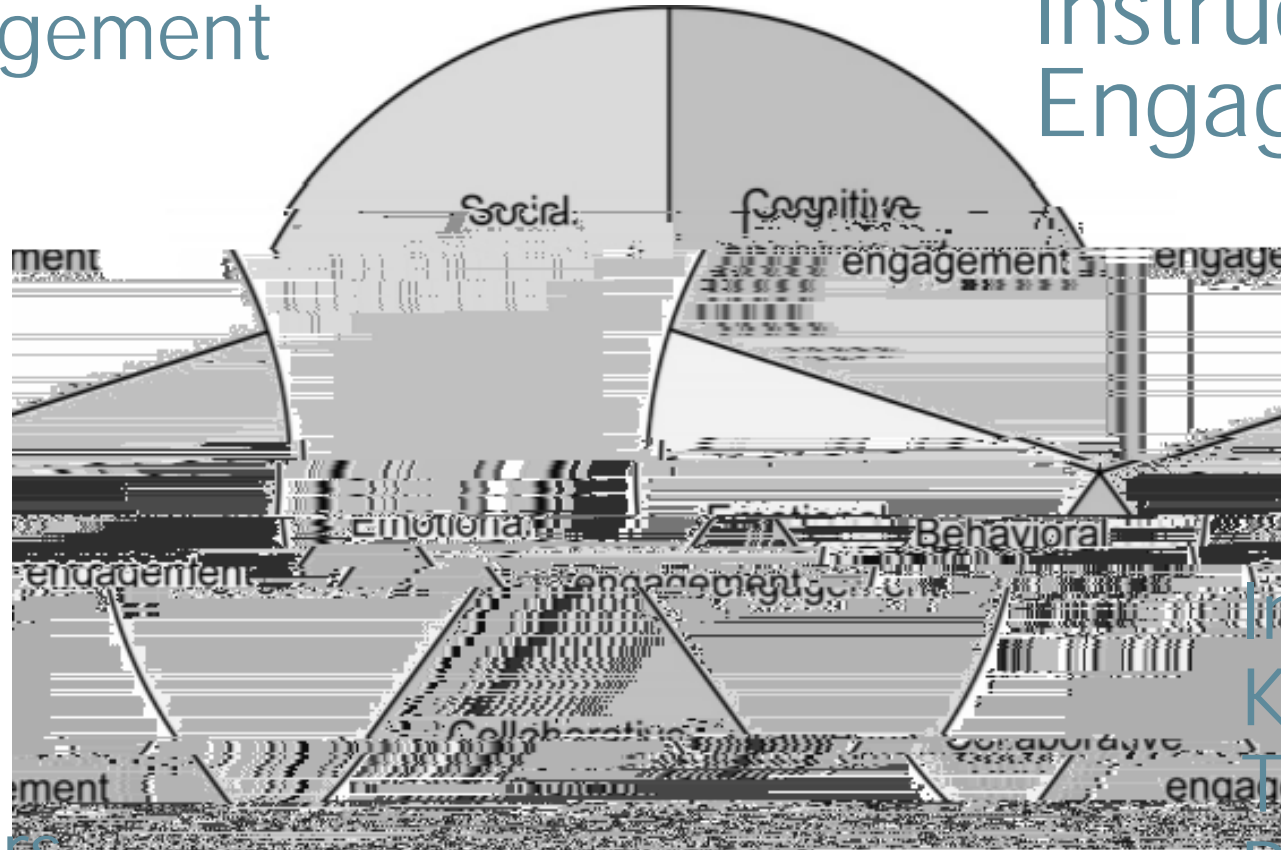
How many tools do you think are available in Moodle to support you and students in online delivery?

# Collaborate – Mapping a Lesson Online

## Establish Routines

- Welcome, provide LO's, agenda

## Pre-assess

- Pre-class forum posts, brainstorm in groups or pairs, Moodle quiz, online quiz tools, poll

## Deliver Theory

- Lecture, watch a film or simulation, play a podcast, have students read independently, invite guest speakers

- Student presentations, questions in the chat, breakout groups, interactive whiteboards, **ONCD** Deliver Theory
